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Parliamentarians take on escape room as part of Coloplast's Catheter Care Challenge to raise awareness of urinary catheter use

 of its kind event, which invites Parliamentarians to test
 their knowledge of catheterisation in order to be able to
 access a specially built locked toilet in a race against time
- The Catheter Care Challenge is raising awareness of the importance of patient choice and improving the quality of life of those who live with/use urinary catheters

On Thursday, 13 July 2023, Coloplast UK, in partnership with MS Trust, Spinal Injuries Association and The Urology Foundation will host a one-of-a-kind escape room event in Parliament. Hosted by the MP for Peterborough, Paul Bristow, Parliamentarians will be invited to participate in the Catheter Care Challenge during which they will hear from patients and healthcare professionals about the impact and experience of using urinary catheters daily.

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MPs and Peers will participate in a short escape room style challenge, which will see them compete against their colleagues and against the clock to access a toilet by answering quick-fire questions about catheters. This challenge has a serious purpose behind it and has been developed to specifically provide participants with first-hand experience of the issues faced by individuals using urinary catheters. Those who answer all the questions correctly will receive the radar key required to open the specially constructed toilet door.

Users of urinary catheters often live with a wide range of conditions, such as spinal injuries or multiple sclerosis. Conditions such as these can significantly affect a person's ability to empty their bladder effectively, which can lead to chronic urinary tract infections (UTIs) and cause a subsequent significant burden on the NHS. In the UK alone, around 14 million people are estimated to be living with bladder conditionsⁱ, and there are over 90,000 people in the UK who use indwelling catheters. This does not include patients who use intermittent catheters and whilst published data is more limited it is estimated this is also in excess of a further 90,000 patients based on industry data.

Speaking ahead of the event, Tabitha Fung, disability rights campaigner, Coloplast Patient Ambassador, and catheter user said:

"As someone who lives with a disability and uses a catheter on a regular basis, I know how urinary incontinence can affect every aspect of a person's life because it is often hidden and can leave

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people feeling frustrated and isolated. My hope is that this event will provide parliamentarians with more information about the everyday struggles that those living with or using urinary catheters face and what needs to be done to ensure everyone has access to high quality care and support."

Mary Speirs, Senior Director, Clinical Services Chronic Care at Coloplast UK said:

"Coloplast is thrilled to partner with MS Trust, Spinal Injuries Association and The Urology Foundation on this innovative and interactive event. Our goal is to put patients at the heart of our work.
